The Friends of Fort Caswell Rifle Range is now a 501c-3 non-profit corporation whose members have worked for years to stabilize and enhance the rifle range pit, one of the few highly visible reminders of the role American troops played in World War I. The group has raised enough money to fully stabilize the structure and has engineering con-tracts in hand. Work is expected to begin as soon as liability issues are resolved.

The range was once part of the larger Fort Caswell complex. U.S. troops learned long-range marksmanship there before heading to the

front lines in Europe. "We could never achieve our goal without the support of the many businesses of Oak Island, Caswell Beach and Southport," the friends group said in a prepared statement. "Above all, we want to thank the Town of Caswell Beach for the generous contributions and the town commissioners for their encouragement and support of our efforts."
