

WWI Snapshot: Edward Vance Gore, 1893-1966

Edward Vance Gore was ordered to report for duty on May 27, 1918, in Southport, N.C. He trained with the Field Artillery Replacement Draft at Camp Jackson, S.C. Pvt. Gore was honorably discharged on Dec. 12, 1918.

Edward Vance Gore passed away in 1966 at age 73. He was laid to rest at Pierce Family Cemetery in Ocean Isle Beach. No military honors are shown.

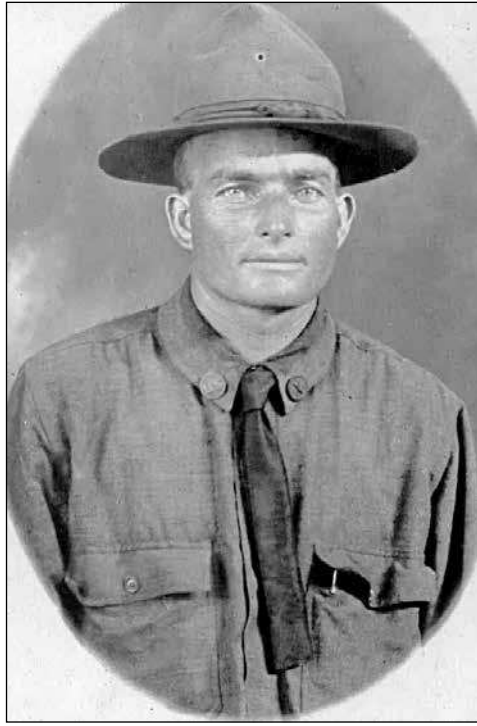
